

## Abstract and Presentation Guidelines

### DREAM Symposium 2022 — Nov 30<sup>th</sup>, 2022

We are **now accepting abstract** submissions from ALL trainees (including undergraduates and graduate students, post-doctoral fellows, residents, fellows, technicians, research associates and community members) who have research projects in any field related to diabetes (type 1 and type 2 diabetes).

The deadline for abstract submissions is 11:59pm **October 31st, 2022**. Please send your submissions in a word document to [dream@chrim.ca](mailto:dream@chrim.ca)

Abstracts should be submitted using 12-point font, with a maximum of 300 words, excluding title, authors and affiliations. Abstracts should be broken down in clearly identifiable components of Background/Introduction, Methods, Results, and Main Findings. The abstracts and posters should clearly communicate the research findings.

### **All submissions will be asked to do a poster presentation in the format below**

Dimensions: 90cm width and 60cm length (QR code is optional)

#### **Poster Session Details:**

The poster session will be held on November 30<sup>th</sup> from 4-7pm in the John Buhler atrium at the University of Manitoba, Bannatyne Campus. Awards will be given to the top 3 poster presentations.

The **judging criteria** for the poster presentations will be:

Visual Appearance \_\_\_\_\_/5

- Poster is well laid out
- Follows an expected format
- Figures and fonts are an appropriate size – easily viewable from a short distance

Communication \_\_\_\_\_/5

- Clear presentation – accessible to broad scientific audience
- On time
- Spoke loudly and clearly

Scientific Content \_\_\_\_\_/5

- Background justified the hypothesis/experiments
- Hypothesis clearly stated
- Methods (control, statistics, novelty, etc.) appropriate
- Results clearly presented
- Conclusions clearly explained and consistent with data

Response to Questions \_\_\_\_\_/5

- Clear knowledge of research area and literature
- Clear knowledge of techniques
- Able to adequately defend experimental results
- Application(s) of research described
